Patricia Henryk Music Scholarship

The International School of Tucson is delighted to announce the 2010-2011 Patricia Henryk Music Scholarship.

Criteria

- Scholars should enter Junior One (aged 5 or 6 on entry)
- Scholars should show an appropriate “attitude towards and aptitude for” Music; voice in particular. A specific level of prior achievement in Music is not required for this award.
- Scholars should exhibit, and continue to demonstrate throughout the term of the award :
 - Academic progress
 - Personal development
 - Extra-curricular involvement
 - Social development

Terms of the Award

- The Patricia Henryk Music Scholarship is to be awarded annually and an annual re-application should be made. The expectation is that each Scholarship will be held for the full term of the School’s Junior School programme, however this is not guaranteed. The Scholar’s continued enrolment at the School is subject to his/her meeting the same requirements as other students and s/he will not be assessed differently, other than as described here.
- The Patricia Henryk Music Scholarship pays 50% of the annual Tuition Fees; the Scholar’s family should be willing and able to meet the balance, and the School’s regular Tuition Fee Agreement should be completed. Other Fees, Registration, and costs such as uniform are the responsibility of the Scholar’s family. The award of a Scholarship shall not preclude the Scholar from holding or applying for additional financial assistance.
- The Scholar must enter the School at the beginning of Semester I of the 2010/2011 academic year; s/he may elect to enter the French/English, German/English or Spanish/English dual-immersion programme and must meet academic requirements for entry. (Where minimum enrolment in a particular language Section is not reached, s/he may elect to enter another.)
- The Scholarships are not available to current or former students of the International School of Tucson.

Application Procedure

- Complete and submit the Scholarship Application Form to reach the School by 15 January 2009.
- A preliminary interview will be held with the candidate and at least one of his/her parents and the School’s Scholarship Committee 15 – 31 January.
- Selected candidates will be called for second interviews with the Head of School 15 – 29 February.
- Decisions will be made by 1 March 2009 and applicants will be notified by email of the outcome.

Scholarship decisions will be made only as described here. The International School of Tucson does not discriminate on the basis of race, religion or national heritage and each child is accepted on his / her individual merits.

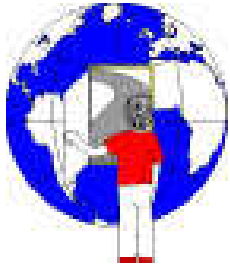

An Overview

The International School of Tucson (“IST”) was founded in August 2005 as Tucson’s first international school with the following Mission :

- Education for an International Community
- Language Immersion
- Values for a Global Society

IST believes that we live in an interconnected community and that we must prepare our children to fit into this community, to know and to understand how people from other countries, cultures and faiths live and act and to be able to make allowances for that; we further believe that our children must be able to meet with their international peers at the same levels and with the same preparation and skills-sets, thus we must prepare our children to meet international standards.

IST believes that knowing more than one language is not only essential for these purposes, but is also intrinsically good, however we also believe that speaking a language alone is insufficient and that our children must be at least bi-literate, which can only come with language-immersion programmes.

IST believes that for a community to function, and for it to live at peace both within and without, we must also form a society rooted in a set of common human values, and for our children to take their place in such a society they too must possess these values : Appreciation; Commitment; Confidence; Co-operation; Creativity; Curiosity; Empathy; Enthusiasm; Independence; Integrity; Respect; Tolerance.

IST offers full-immersion Pre-School programmes in French, German and Spanish (Chinese and Arabic coming soon) and dual-immersion Junior School programmes in French/English, German/English and Spanish/English. IST’s international faculty come from the countries of the languages taught and hold degrees and teaching credentials.

IST leases facilities in central Tucson, close to the University of Arizona and Downtown and to major routes in and out of and transversing the city. Current plans call for a PK – J5 (Pre-School to Elementary) programme on the current site(s).
